### **INNOVATIVE GROWTH AND PARTNERSHIPS**

On April 20, our organization was honored to speak at AdvantAge Ontario's 2017 annual convention on the topic of "The Evolving State of Seniors' Campuses: Where to Next?" Our Association's thrust this year is the need for government to support and facilitate seniors' campuses. Seniors' campuses can decrease the demand for Long-Term Care, improve service quality and responsiveness, as well as improve the overall quality of health and social well-being of seniors. Our experience at Pleasant Manor and Tabor Manor is that it works! Seniors are well supported in their own apartments through our Supportive Housing program. Seniors are participating in on-site Exercise and Falls Prevention Classes and congregate dining. We are proud of our campuses of care and the role they are playing to keep people healthy and well.

## RELATIONAL EXCELLENCE AND CULTURAL PRESERVATION

On April 21, Pleasant Manor and Tabor Manor received a very special honour from our provincial association, AdvantAge Ontario. Our CEO, Tim Siemens, was presented with the Leadership Award at the Association's annual convention. The award recognizes an individual who has demonstrated exemplary leadership in seniors care, in their local organization, in the greater community, and across the province. Tim was nominated by leading members of the provincial association who were excited to shine a light on his many achievements, including his work on the Board of AdvantAge Ontario, his involvement in many other boards and committees serving Ontario seniors, and his passion and advocacy for those he serves. In his acceptance speech, Tim recognized and thanked the Pleasant Manor and Tabor Manor team for "together creating an organization that is a leader of care in Niagara and the province of Ontario". Last week, the Ontario government announced \$100 million over the next three years in additional funding to expand dementia care and to support the implementation of a dementia strategy in Ontario. We understand that new supports will include expanding behavioural supports in all Long-Term Care Homes. This will be very much welcomed. We are very grateful to our employees, who, working in an environment where there is a high prevalence of dementia, are choosing to live out our values of love, quality, and excellence each and every shift. # AN INSIDE LOOK AT THE "BUSINESS" OF PLEASANT MANOR AND TABOR MANOR

With a combined annual operating budget of over \$19 million, Pleasant Manor and Tabor Manor represent significant business. Over 320 employees count on these homes for their livelihood, and they serve over 600 residents and tenants who make this their home.

Homes they are indeed, but behind the scenes there is a daily hum of activity that keeps our homes operating smoothly and in compliance with all the rules, regulations, laws, and guidelines that govern our work.

As a Board of Directors, we take our responsibility to oversee the work of our management team very seriously, and we hold our CEO and senior staff accountable. Our Board is comprised of men and women chosen for their skills, experience, track record of leadership, and Christian commitment. Their combined expertise and passion for the mission of our homes has proven to be invaluable as they govern.

The Board of Directors is not the only body that scrutinizes the management practices of our homes. The Ministry of Health and Long Term Care, the Local Health Integration Network, as well as the Ministry of Labour, all have strict regulations that both homes must follow. Inspections happen without advance notice, and we welcome their scrutiny. They keep our homes operating at the highest possible level of safety, professionalism, and compliance with legislation.

To ensure that all our financial dealings are above reproach, we arrange for an annual audit by an outside accounting firm, and our Board reviews the finances of the homes monthly. The Canada Revenue Agency is another overseer of our business.

As a Board, we are very proud of the excellent reputation our homes have earned with the many government ministries and other agencies that we report to. The residents and tenants we serve are indeed in good hands!
