Every October - November, the Nursing and other Departments get into full swing with preparing for increased viruses that usually peak in November to February. This year we have seen a few viruses make an appearance already – We have actually had two outbreaks occur in the Month of October! We are not alone, Public health has informed us that there are a lot of early “activity” this year. What is an outbreak you may ask? An outbreak is declared by Public Health when 2 or more residents have a specific set of symptoms. The purpose is to contain it within the specific unit or home, to avoid spread outside and to avoid those from outside bringing something else in.

When an outbreak is declared: we remind folks to clean their hands often; we enhance cleaning; staff use gowns, gloves, and masks more often; we put up signs to inform visitors to limit visits – especially if they are sick; we limit programs that may increase the spread; and we try to keep staff on specific floors as much as possible.

We ask for your patience and support as we work hard to protect our residents here at Tabor Manor.
