Family Visitations

We are looking forward to the resumption of family visits. We will now be offering both indoor & outdoor visits. Details and requirements that must be met for visits are summarized below.

Each resident will be offered 1 (one) visit a week and may have 2 (two) visitors at a time.

Outdoor Visits

- An appointment must be booked.
- Check-in with the screener 5-10 minutes before your visit.
- Clean your hands. When you arrive, clean your hands using hand sanitizer. Again before you leave.
- Wear a mask. You will need to bring your own cloth mask or face covering for outdoor visits.
- You no longer need a recent COVID-19 test for outdoor visits.
- Must maintain physical distance. For everyone's safety, avoid physical contact during your visit, remains two metres (six feet) apart at all times.

Indoor Visits

- Visitors must have tested negative for COVID-19 within last 2 weeks.
- An appointment must be booked.
- Check-in with the screener 5-10 minutes before your visit.
- Clean your hands. When you arrive, clean your hands using hand sanitizer. Again before you leave.
- Wear a mask. A surgical/procedure mask must be worn at all times, and will be provided by the home.
- Must maintain physical distance. For everyone's safety, avoid physical contact during your visit, remains two metres (six feet) apart at all times.
 - Any non-adherence to these rules will be the basis for discontinuation of visits.

High risk food items will be denied entry into the building. We thank you for your understanding at this time". Please make sure any items brought in are clearly labelled.
