A Call to Prayer

Recent world events have shown us that we live in increasingly turbulent times. What has been happening since the Lord's Ascension, and most recently throughout the world confirms what The Bible has forewarned us about, that 'in the last days perilous times will come.' (2 Tim. 3:1)

Jesus Himself cautioned His disciples; "See to it that no one misleads you. ⁶ Many will come in My name, saying, 'I am *He!*' and they will mislead many. ⁷ When you hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not be alarmed; *those things* must take place; but *that is* not yet the end. ⁸ For nation will rise up against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be earthquakes in various places; there will *also* be famines. These things are *only* the beginning of birth pains. (Mark 13:6-8)

Yet, that is not the end of the story of history. Jesus told His disciples not to despair in His absence. He was going to prepare an eternal home for all His saints, and will come again to bring us to Himself to enjoy His Presence forever! (John 14:1-6) Praise the Lord, Jesus is coming again!

² First of all, then, I urge that requests, prayers, intercession, and thanksgiving be made in behalf of all people, ² for kings and all who are in authority, so that we may lead a tranquil and quiet life in all godliness and dignity. ³ This is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, ⁴ who wants all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. ⁵ For there is one God, and one mediator also between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus, ⁶ who gave Himself as a ransom for all, the testimony given at the proper time. ⁷ For this I was appointed as a preacher and an apostle (I am telling the truth, I am not lying), as a teacher of the Gentiles in faith and truth. (1 Timothy 2:2-7)
