I shouted 'WOW!', and gladly reclaimed that twenty for present use. But the content found in those pages in the book had been worth far more to me since, than the \$20 dollars lost inside it!

### How do you feel about your Bible?

Like that book, when I open my Bible, I know that what it contains is more priceless and valuable to me; far beyond a world full of \$20 bills!

Of course, every good Christian knows that we *should* value our Bible, study our Bible, and cherish our Bible. But just because we *should* feel a certain way doesn't mean that we actually do feel that way. Sometimes, we can get so bogged down with the cares of this world and the difficulties of life that reading our Bible feels more like a chore than something that we cherish.
