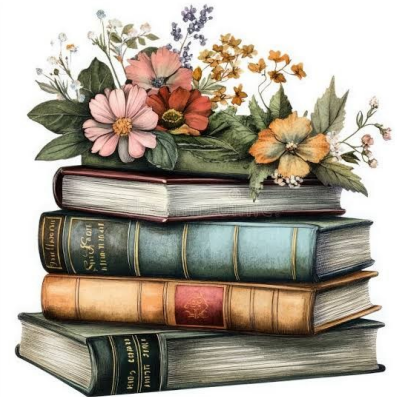

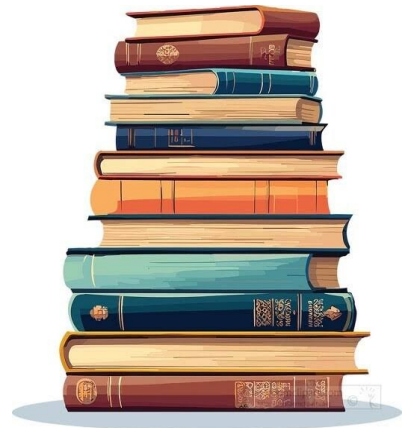


Welcoming Students to Our Home

The Flood, The Ark, The Rainbow & The Cross!

While enjoying our vacation in BC, I saw on the news images of areas around our house in Niagara on the Lake under water! After a quick call home, I was assured that our house was not flooded...again! Praise The Lord! We had just completed restoration of our basement from water damage from a cracked foundation in the Spring!

The Flood

The recent floods in the Niagara Region and Nepal also remind us of the world's greatest catastrophe...The Flood in the time of Noah! The Flood was God's judgement on sin, evil and rebellion.

Genesis 6:5-7 says, 'Then the Lord saw that the wickedness of man was great on the earth, and that every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually. The Lord was sorry that He had made man on the earth, and He was grieved in His heart.' God saw that sin, evil, corruption and violence were worldwide (Gen. 6:11). Sounds a lot like today too!

God used a worldwide Flood of water to wash away sinful, rebellious humanity. The Flood can serve as a reminder of God's justice; He will punish sin.

The Ark

But there is another reminder from the story of the Flood. God also showed His mercy and grace! Genesis 6:8 says, 'But Noah found favor in the eyes of the Lord.' Because of Noah's integrity, The Lord provided a way for Noah, his family, and the animals to be saved from destruction! He guided him to build the Ark as the vessel of salvation (Gen. 6:14).

The Rainbow

Once the Flood had subsided, God gave Noah, and all humanity for all time, a sign of His promise never to flood the whole earth again...it was the Rainbow! Even though the Rainbow may be seen and misunderstood in our society today, God's original intention was for it to be a reminder for all of history of His promise not to judge sin by Flood again. It also reminds us of His gracious offer of salvation by mercy and grace!

The Cross

The ultimate symbol of God's judgement on sin and salvation is the Cross of Christ! Just as God used The Flood and The Ark to both judge and rescue, so too did God use the death of Christ to pay the penalty for our sin, and, to rescue us by His Cross!

1 Corinthians 1:18 says, 'For the word of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.'

From now on, every time you see a Rainbow remember God's promise and The Ark of God's salvation. And when you see a Cross, remember God's judgement of sin, and His gracious provision for salvation in Jesus Christ!

The Cross of Christ will save us too!*

A Marriage Observed

Ephesians 4:26-32

Of all United States presidents, Jimmy Carter had the longest marriage. He and his wife Rosalyn were married for seventy-seven years. When Carter was asked the secret to his long, successful marriage, he replied, “Choose the right person to marry.” Beyond that, he named three other concepts for marital success: reconciliation, communication, and devotion to faith.

We see the idea of reconciliation in Ephesians 4:26: “Do not let the sun go down while you are still angry.” The Carters took this seriously. “Every night, we try to make sure we’re completely reconciled from all the arguments during the day,” Jimmy once said. We can also see the secret to Christlike communication in Ephesians 4. Paul wrote, “Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you” (v. 32).

God ordained marriage as something good—something established by Him (Genesis 2:24; Hebrews 13:4). Proverbs 18:22 says that marriage is a divine blessing: “He who finds a wife finds what is good and receives favor from the Lord.” And the way we treat one another, in marriage and in the entire body of Christ, can encourage and positively affect others. Whether we’re single or married, our words and actions can truly reflect the loving, forgiving heart of Christ.

How can God help you reflect Christ in your relationships? What does it mean to be compassionate and forgiving today?

Ephesians 4:26-32 begins with an assumption that anger is inevitable: “In your anger do not sin” (v. 26). But Paul quickly guards against any sinful expression of anger: “Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice” (v. 31). The emphasis in this passage, as in other epistles, isn’t only on behaviors that give the “devil a foothold” (v. 27) and “grieve the Holy Spirit” (v. 30). It’s also on what we replace our actions with as we “put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness” (v. 24). Our individual submission to God’s supernatural righteousness makes it possible to follow His example: “Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you” (v. 32). In all our relationships, God can help us reflect the forgiving heart of Jesus.

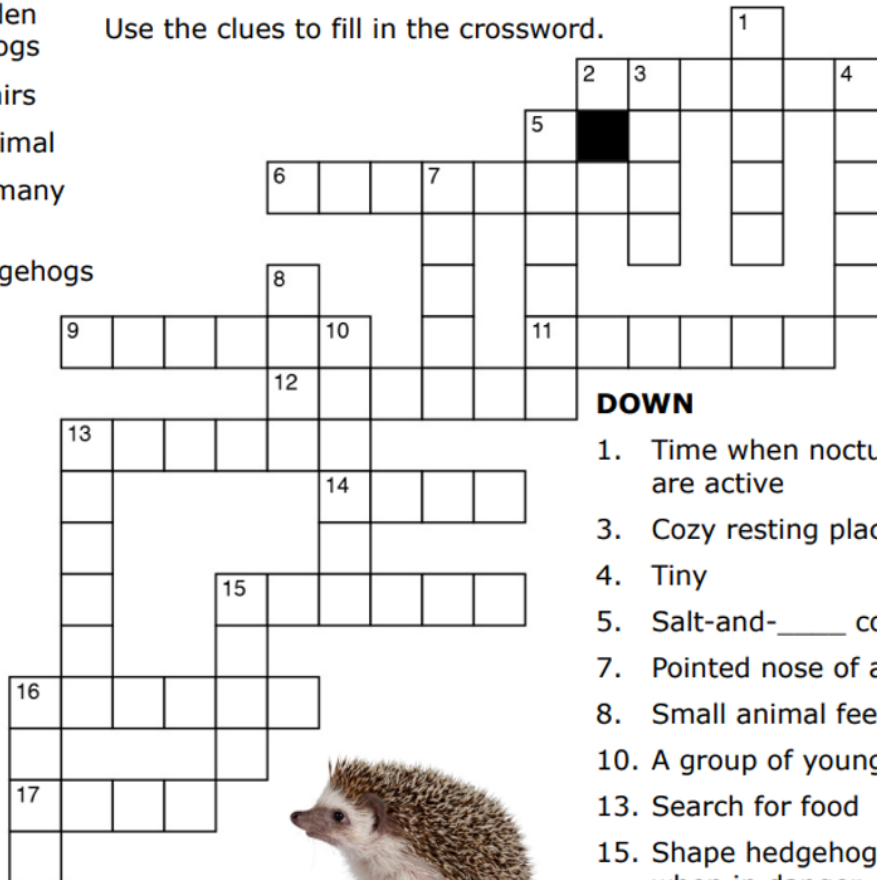
